- Growing in Love of God and Neighbor. Trinity's call is to strengthen relationships with God and one another, serving Christ in all persons and loving our neighbors as ourselves.
- Offering faith and partnership in our community. Trinity has had a long and distinguished presence in our broader community. This includes building partnerships to found MEND, which provides affordable housing for seniors and others and Project Interaction, a network of churches feeding the hungry and supporting a variety of ministries for the Camden community. Further, we are home to The Trinity Preschool, offering children a joyful, loving, environment in which to learn and grow, founded on Christian ideals.
- Engaging our congregation. Trinity offers education and formation for children, youth, and adults to help us know and serve the Lord. Chapel, Sunday School, choirs, and youth programs build a strong faith foundation for our young people, while worship, Bible study, forums, and friendships support the spiritual growth of adults of all ages. Fellowship and service opportunities such as our Blueberry Festival, Bingo Night, MLK Day of Service, and Christmas in July create a strong sense of community within our congregation.

I joined Trinity in 1985, and despite moving from Moorestown, to Lumberton, and now Philadelphia, Trinity has remained my church 'home,' where I continue to find community.

Our vision for the future requires making Trinity stronger and more welcoming for all.

Trinity's current church, chapel, parish hall and rectory buildings have provided a beautiful home for worship, fellowship, and spiritual care since being gifted to the parish nearly 100 years ago by Eldridge Reeves Johnson, founder of the Victor Talking Machine Company. We seek to make investments to strengthen our buildings and community to honor the gift that is Trinity.



Trinity is embarking on a capital campaign of \$1.5 million to raise the funds to repair, replace, renew, and add what is needed. Our investment plans include the following:

Providing accessibility with a special focus on people with physical limitations

Create barrier-free entrances to Sanctuary and Parish Hall; install a new lighting system for Sanctuary; incorporate space for wheelchairs in pews; build a wheelchair lift in current Reception Room; and create accessible restrooms on main floor of Parish Hall

2 Creating a comfortable and welcoming environment to improve our buildings' usefulness to our parish community

Air-condition the Parish Hall and kitchens; update restrooms in the Parish Hall and classroom buildings; provide new meeting and storage spaces; and renovate the kitchen spaces

3 Making repairs and improvements to enhance our safety and strengthen our structures

Install new smoke detectors, fire suppression systems, and fire-safe doors; repair damaged walks, building walls, outside steps, bell tower, and graveyard wall; and replace leaking windows and old air conditioners in preschool wing

Supporting new and existing outreach programs and opportunities

Make high-impact grants to launch or improve programs in our partner organizations in the community and across our Diocese
