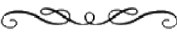

About Trinity Church

Trinity Church was organized in 1837 by the rector and members of St. Mary’s Church, Colestown (now Cherry Hill Township). An obelisk in Colestown Cemetery marks the site of St. Mary’s church, which burned to the ground in 1899. The Moorestown congregation raised funds for a church building to be erected on our present site; it was constructed and consecrated in 1838. The rector, The Reverend Francis P. Lee, noted, “It is a beautiful structure of brownstone, with a graceful spire and a comfortable basement story for the use of the Sunday School”. The current church complex was built in 1928 and was the gift of a single benefactor, Eldridge Johnson.

Trinity Church offers many opportunities for individuals and families to serve both in the church and in the community. By becoming involved in a commission or a specific event or ministry, you will meet other parishioners and hopefully become an integral part of our church family. Volunteer opportunities include: Fellowship, Property, Christian Formation, Outreach, Health and Music Commissions just to name a few.

There are many opportunities to participate in music at Trinity Church. The Trinity Choir is the primary parish choir and sings at the 9:00 a.m. Eucharist. The choir sings a repertoire ranging from Renaissance motets to 20th century works. The Coventry Choir is a small ensemble that sings for the 11:15 a.m. service. The choir prepares its own repertoire of *a cappella* motets as well as canticles for Morning Prayer. The Canterbury Choir is for young singers in grades 4 and up; the Carol Choir is for those in grades 2 - 3; and the Cherub Choir for children in grades K-1.

Welcome, visitors and guests! Thank you for joining us in worship today - we're glad you're here. We hope that you will find food for your spirit, and a warm community connection today. Please speak to one of the clergy, or sign the guest register in the Tower entrance, if you are looking for a church home, are in need of prayer, or have any questions.

In worship this season we use the maroon "Hymnal 1982" (Hymns starting with S are at the front of the hymnal, other numbers follow in normal order) and the "Holy Eucharist" booklet found in the pew racks. All the texts you need for worship are found there and in the program in your hands. Anyone around you should be happy to help any time the book-juggling becomes confusing. Please join in with all our prayers and hymns, as your presence helps to complete our prayer.

Nursery care is available for children under age 2 during the 9:00 service. (Preschool Rainbow room).

The Outreach Commission asks that you help support the ongoing work of the **St. Vincent de Paul Society of Moorestown** during the **month of October**, The Society of St. Vincent de Paul in Moorestown serves the needs of Moorestown residents who have fallen behind on their financial obligations due to job loss, accident or injury, prolonged illness, or other possible crises that may turn their worlds upside down. The group is comprised of members from a number of churches in Moorestown., including Trinity. We assist in paying rent, mortgages, utilities and other essential services. We do not pay security deposits, internet, phone, credit cards, or property taxes. The goal is to help our “guests” to get back on their feet and alleviate the stress involved in doing that. If food is an ongoing issue, we sign them up for a monthly pick up of several bags of food staples at St. Mary’s in Medford who works directly with the South Jersey Food Bank. They are also provided with a list of food pantries in Moorestown. Please consider giving to **St. Vincent de Paul** throughout the year. It serves as a very fine example of **Neighbors helping Neighbors** in our community.

The 23rd Annual Blessing of the Animals Service will be held today at 3:00 pm in the Trinity Church Cemetery. Bring your cats, dogs, and other pets for a short service including hymns, readings, an anthem by the Carol and Canterbury Choirs and the blessing of all animals by the clergy. In case of inclement weather, the service will be held in the Parish Hall.

The Church Office will be closed on Monday, October 8th for Columbus Day.

Scholastic Book Fair: Today after the 9:00 service, visit the preschool wing for our Fall Scholastic Book Fair. Come support the Preschool and teachers by purchasing books for young children. Scholastic provides a wide variety of affordable books including holiday and Christian books.

Consecration Sunday is coming! On Sunday, October 28, you are invited to celebrate the generosity and vitality of Trinity with us at a catered meal after each service. We will not call anyone or visit to ask for a pledge. But we will call you to find out if we can count you in for the meal, so make your reservation now!

We are starting a NEW ministry here at Trinity called “The Joy Crusade”. One of the lessons in the Discipleship for Episcopalians study we use for "Friends with Jesus," is about Listening for God's calling in your life. This might be something that God is calling you to do. This will be a ministry of encouragement, one we can share with our shut-ins, and parishioners who are sick or hospitalized, by visiting, sending a card, or calling them on the phone to see how they are doing. It is simple things like this that show people we care.
