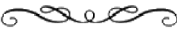

About Trinity Church

Trinity Church was organized in 1837 by the rector and members of St. Mary’s Church, Colestown (now Cherry Hill Township). An obelisk in Colestown Cemetery marks the site of St. Mary’s church, which burned to the ground in 1899. The Moorestown congregation raised funds for a church building to be erected on our present site; it was constructed and consecrated in 1838. The rector, The Reverend Francis P. Lee, noted, “It is a beautiful structure of brownstone, with a graceful spire and a comfortable basement story for the use of the Sunday School”. The current church complex was built in 1928 and was the gift of a single benefactor, Eldridge Johnson.

Trinity Church offers many opportunities for individuals and families to serve both in the church and in the community. By becoming involved in a commission or a specific event or ministry, you will meet other parishioners and hopefully become an integral part of our church family. Volunteer opportunities include: Fellowship, Property, Christian Formation, Outreach, Health and Music Commissions just to name a few.

There are many opportunities to participate in music at Trinity Church. The Trinity Choir is the primary parish choir and sings at the 9:00 a.m. Eucharist. The choir sings a repertoire ranging from Renaissance motets to 20th century works. The Coventry Choir is a small ensemble that sings for the 11:15 a.m. service. The choir prepares its own repertoire of *a cappella* motets as well as canticles for Morning Prayer. The Canterbury Choir is for young singers in grades 4 and up; the Carol Choir is for those in grades 2 - 3; and the Cherub Choir for children in grades K-1.

Good Shepherds Club: This Sunday our Good Shepherd's Club will be making cards to send messages of love and support to the community of the Tree of Life Synagogue in Pittsburgh. Thank you to all who attended and helped us celebrate Consecration Sunday last week!

A total of 102 giving units completed Estimate of Giving Cards on Sunday.

48 of these giving units increased their financial commitment above their last year's amount. This is a 9% increase in giving from these households above last year.

A total of 21 new giving units (households who did not make a giving commitment for 2018) completed Estimate of Giving Cards.

Total giving from all households completing a card to date is \$301,000

Based on last year's giving records, we can expect to receive \$190,000 during the coming year from people who have consistent giving patterns during the past twelve months but were not present to complete a card on Consecration Sunday.

Based on the average total of loose offerings during the past three years, we can expect to receive \$39,000 during the coming year from that source.

This gives us an estimated total of \$530,000 in giving for 2019, a 2% increase over the 2018 Budget.
