Parish Notes

We enter a new phase of worshipping together in different places and ways this weekend. Our two in-person services will be streamed on our website, YouTube, and Facebook, and we'll continue to pray together by phone. **Registration for the in-person service is required** to help with spacing and contact tracing, and you must register by 8 a.m. on Saturday. The registration form is <u>available on our website</u>. As we make changes in our worship schedule, it's important to remember that however we are worshiping – by phone, online, in-person – we are praying together as one community. None of these services is the "right" service for everyone, none is "more important" than another. Whatever way you can join in this prayer, you are an essential part of our wholeness as we bring our hearts and souls to God.

It is also essential to our wholeness that we continue to check in on one another, strengthen relationships without physical meetings, and BE the church in scattered places while this time of distancing continues. This difficult separation is an act of love, a sacrifice we make as a community to help protect the most vulnerable, and the health of the whole state.

The office will be partially staffed on Mondays, Wednesdays, and Thursdays for telephone inquiries and contactless drop-off/pick-up where necessary. If you need to pick something up or drop it off, please call before coming to the church, as our office hours will vary some from week to week.

Food pantry hours are <u>Wednesday mornings from 9-11 am</u>. <u>Pantry</u> <u>needs:</u> canned soup (hearty soups with meat), canned meats: tuna, chicken, beef stew. Thank you for all the donations. The recipients have been so appreciative of our ability to give out bags of food and gift cards to these families since March.

Sunday School Update: Sunday school will be modified during these unprecedented times. Our goal is to study, worship, and grow in Christ's love together, while adhering to current Diocesan and State safety guidelines. We look forward to providing a multi-generational program with new volunteer opportunities. For those of you who would like to revisit your Sunday school days, please join us! All ages are welcome.

Since we are not yet permitted to hold in person Sunday school, our program will be virtual. Each week, a video lesson link will be emailed to you in the weekly announcements, with hardcopies of the curriculum provided via USPS mail, if needed, on a monthly basis. Additionally, we will come together on the first Sunday each month for "All-in Sunday" with our Rite13 and J2A students. We welcome volunteers and encourage families to participate together. For students entering the first grade, Miss Stacy will offer opportunities for the Communion class to Zoom together, as well as other activities. Since we typically begin the official Communion curriculum in January, the children will share in the congregation's lessons until then. It is during times like these, we are reminded that "We are the church." Let's make this time spiritually fulfilling and fun, TOGETHER as one Trinity family.

Hymn of the week: Since we can't sing our wonderful hymns during the COVID-19 pandemic, we can nevertheless think about and appreciate them. Each week, we'll focus on one that we might have sung, something appropriate for the readings of the day. This is an opportunity to learn about the rich history of those who wrote the hymns and to focus on the meaning, beauty, and inspiration of their words. We'll "Sing to the Lord" in our hearts!

This week's **Hymn of the week,** is "Praise, my soul, the King of Heaven," (#410 in The Hymnal 1982), written in 1834 by Henry Francis Lyte. Queen Elizabeth II chose this hymn from Psalm 103 to be sung for her wedding in Westminster Abbey in 1947 on the 100th anniversary of Lyte's death. It emphasizes God's mercy, care, and forgiveness despite our "feeble frame" and our eagerness to praise him for his "grace and favor to his people in distress."

While serving as an Anglican rector, Lyte wrote many hymns and poems. Despite frail health and weak lungs, Henry established a Sunday school of eight hundred children in Brixham [England] and ministered to sailors on the docks, concerned about their educational as well as spiritual development. He was much concerned about the betterment of society, including the abolishment of slavery in England. This is the poet minister who also wrote another favorite hymn, "Abide With Me," as he was dying of tuberculosis in his 50s. Lyte always had a special desire to give to the world something that would live to the glory of God. The class is very informal: we read God's word; we pray; we talk; we don't talk if we don't want to; we laugh; we cry occasionally; we get to know each other; we grow spiritually. Join the journey of racial reconciliation and healing: Many of us have become heart-sick about the unrelenting episodes of persecution and violence against Black people and others of color in this country. We promise in the Baptismal Covenant to "strive for justice and peace among all people, and respect the dignity of every human being", so this is our work as Christians. What is it going to take to turn things around? This is the definition of repentance, recognizing our sins and turning in a different direction. The truth is that white people have to recognize the societal sins resulting from our white-dominated culture, and work to change our own hearts, the hearts of others, and societal structures that perpetuate inequality. Anti-racism work does not blame people for being white; it constructively calls on white people to accept responsibility and do the work needed for change. This is challenging and difficult work, and the country is not going to change overnight.

Join your fellow parishioners on this journey. Trinity is starting with a 21-day Racial Equity challenge to provide opportunities to read, listen and learn about racial injustice, and we will continue the journey in

If you think a message asking for your help might be legitimate, reach out to the person who is supposed to have sent it using a method you know is safe: start a new email to that person, using the email in the directory or the contact form on our website (*not* a reply), or call us.

About Trinity Church

Trinity Episcopal Church in Moorestown, New Jersey is a broad and inclusive church serving Moorestown, Mount Laurel, and surrounding communities. We have room under our roof for people from different backgrounds and cultures, with a wide variety of customs, points of view, lifestyles and talents. People of every gender, race, age, orientation, and identity share equally in leadership and in the sacraments, in fellowship and service. Our call is to strengthen relationships with God and one another, serving Christ in all persons and loving our neighbors as ourselves. We invite you to worship with us, learn with us, serve with us, to grow spiritually and to make new friends here.

Trinity Church was established in 1837 by the rector and members of St. Mary's Church in Colestown, now Cherry Hill, New Jersey. In 1928, the present complex of church, chapel, parish house, and offices (formerly the rectory) was given by Eldridge Reeves Johnson, the founder and president of the Victor Talking Machine Company of Camden and Moorestown resident (though not a Trinity member, nor even an Episcopalian!). The altar and some of the windows of the original 1939 Trinity building are preserved in our chapel, which is open all week long for private prayer. Our congregation has also developed our cloister garden into a place that attracts residents and visitors to enjoy the peaceful beauty, and our education wing hosts Trinity Preschool, a lively, joyful, growing community, five days a week.
